“Over the last year, Traprock Director Pat Hynes has spearheaded an effort to raise \$10,000 to plant 10,000 trees and seedlings in the Dong Son commune of Vietnam,” an area severely affected by US spraying of toxic Agent Orange during the Vietnam War. Thanks to fundraisers and contributions, \$12,000 was raised, all of which has gone to the local tree planting effort.
